HUME CITY COUNCIL CITY NATURE CHALLENGE 2024

Friday 26 April to Monday 29 April

Citizen science is free, fun, and easy to do on your own, or with family and friends. In this four-day biodiversity survey, head outdoors with your phone or camera to record as many wild animals, plants, and fungi as you can find.

Over 475 cities will be involved worldwide, with people searching for wildlife in their gardens, local parks, and creeks. Upload photos to iNaturalist by 5 May for these observations to count, and they are automatically included into projects. Hume City is collaborating with 25 local governments and several organisations to form the Creater Melbourne project.

A lead-up iNaturalist training session will prepare people to take part. Guided nature walks are planned over the weekend to look for various species.
